

Ill. and Most Worshipful Bro., Jess N. Raines, 33° 163rd Grand Master of Masons in Ohio For Whom the Reunion is Named

Ill. Bro. Jess N. Raines, 33°, of Malta, was elected the 163rd Grand Master of Masons, in Ohio, on Oct. 13, 2018. As Grand Master, MWB Raines presides over 450 lodges throughout the state, with a membership of 75,000 Ohio Masons.

MWB Raines was raised in McConnelsville, OH, and graduated from Morgan High School in 1992. He continued his education at Marietta College, graduating in 1996 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Accounting. While at Marietta, Jess was a member of Delta Tau Delta Fraternity, where he held various leadership positions, and belonged to the honorary business fraternity, Tau Pi Phi. He also earned the rank of Eagle Scout in 1992.

In September 2001, Jess married Kelly Elaine Wolford of Marietta, OH. Jess and Kelly are blessed with two sons, Jordan and Logan, who attend Morgan Local Schools. They are active in youth sports, playing soccer, basketball and track and field. The couple resides on the family farm in Malta. In his professional life, MWB Raines is a Certified Public Accountant and currently serves as the Vice President of Finance and Administration at Washington State Community College in Marietta.

He is active in his community, coaching youth soccer, attending his boys' sporting events, and is the Chief Financial Officer of the Morgan Education Foundation.

He is Past President and Past Treasurer of the Morgan County Shrine Club, Past Chairman of the Muskingum Valley Chapter of the American Red Cross and serves on the Board of Directors of the Economic Roundtable of the Ohio Valley. Jess and his family are members of Malta United Methodist Church at Malta.



In 1998, he began his Masonic career by joining Valley Lodge No. 145 in Malta.

He served as the Worshipful Master, or presiding officer of the lodge, in 2001-03. Masons use the original definition of the word worshipful: honorable. English mayors and judges are addressed by the title of "Worshipful" even today. As Grand Master, members of the fraternity will call Brother Raines "Most Worshipful Brother." He is an Honorary Member of several Lodges throughout the state, including the first Masonic Lodge in Ohio, American Union No. 1, in Marietta.


His service to the Grand Lodge of Ohio began in 2009 when he was appointed as District Deputy Grand Master, serving three years until being appointed Junior Grand Deacon on April 21, 2012, by Most Worshipful Brother Kevin B. Todd. He was subsequently appointed as Senior Grand Deacon, Grand Marshal, Grand Orator, and was elected Junior Grand Warden in Columbus in 2015, Senior Grand Warden in Sandusky in 2016, Deputy Grand Master in Dayton in 2017, and he was elected to serve the Brethren of the Great State of Ohio as Grand Master, being Installed in Sandusky on Oct. 13, 2018. He has been active in several Masonic organizations in his lifetime. (*Continued on page 9.*)



Named after Leon M. Abbott, Sovereign Grand Commander from 1921 to 1932, the Abbott Scholarship Program provides financial support for the continuing undergraduate and graduate education of Scottish Rite Masons, young men and women from Scottish Rite families, and Masonic-related youth groups.

Eligibility: Those meeting any of the following criteria are eligible to apply for the 2018 Abbott Scholarship program for undergraduate studies:


- A Scottish Rite Mason of the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction
- A student directly related (bloodline or by legal means) to a Scottish Rite Mason in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction or a member of a youth organization sponsored by the Masonic fraternity in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction who is:
 - A high school senior, a currently accepted at an accredited trade school who has attained a minimum grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale.
 - A high school senior, or undergraduate, or graduate student currently enrolled at an accredited college or university.


