
FROM THE MOST WISE MASTER

EVENT OF THE YEAR: MASONIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Have you ever been hungry and literally not have food in the house or be able to get food for the house? Luckily, most of us have never been in that situation. However, there are too many people in our local area where this is a regular occurrence. There are many reasons how and why this happens. Regardless of reasons, it happens. We are taught in our degrees that the three great tenants of a Mason's profession are brotherly love, relief and truth. I know that we would all do what we can to relieve the distress of others to the full extent of what we are able. The economy is in trouble, inflation is going wild, food banks are overwhelmed, and the need for others is growing. Each of us can help.

For 33 years, the Masonic Assistance Program (MAP) has provided food baskets year-round to Masons and those in the community who have a need. Anyone knowing of a brother in need may contact the Secretary of the Valley of Akron or the MAP Chairman, and the Brother will be provided with a food basket or grocery store gift certificate. Other assistance may be available based on need and available funds.

Last year, approximately 105 baskets (\$100 value of groceries) were distributed to our own members, veterans and others in need. These gifts are funded solely by donations from Masons, Lodges, Valley of Akron, Eastern Star Chapters, Amaranth Courts, the Shrine and other bodies. The program is financially administered by the Valley of Akron.

We would like to continue our generosity to the communities as we have in the past at Christmas time. One hundred \$100 baskets costs \$10,000. To do this and have funds for needs throughout the year, we need to raise approximately \$7,000. Yes, this is a lot of money. But I believe that the Masonic Bodies of the greater Summit County area have the charity and generosity to reach this goal.

TITUS EARNS HGA AWARD

Sublime Prince Chris Titus, a 32° Mason from the Valley of Akron, has been awarded the esteemed **Hauts Grades Academy (HGA)** Award, in recognition of his dedication to advancing his Masonic knowledge.

He is the first in the 21st Masonic District to achieve this award. Through the HGA program, Chris undertook a rigorous educational journey that began with an in-depth study of the 29 degrees of the Scottish Rite, NMJ.

Titus, an active traveler in the 21st District and the entire world, wrote a research paper titled "Abrahamic Values: Scottish Rite Values in Islam, Judaism, and Christianity."

This first and foundational level required an immersive dive into the symbolism and rituals that define Scottish Rite Masonry. It set the stage for personal growth and understanding of the rich Masonic tradition.

In Level Two, Brother Titus engaged in reflective essays on selected Scottish Rite degrees, allowing him to connect the teachings with his personal Masonic journey.

His final achievement came in Level Three, where he composed a research paper exploring a topic of his choice, ranging from history and ritual to the philosophical aspects of the Scottish Rite.

This paper, reviewed and approved by the HGA committee, capped his distinguished accomplishment and reflects his deep commitment to Masonic scholarship and leadership.

"The HGA program encouraged me to look at each degree and identify what I liked or disliked about it," explains Titus. "Some degrees resonated with me more than others, and I was challenged to understand why."

Brother Titus, as a graduate, has earned the honor of becoming a Scottish Rite Hauts Grades Academic, and is entitled to include the letters HGA after his name. A certificate and HGA jewel were also awarded.

Titus is the Deputy Master, Aroba Lodge of Perfection. He is WM of Meridian Sun Lodge #69.



Your Blue Envelope Appeal will be arriving in October. Please consider donating to this valuable charity.



The goal set by our Supreme Council and the Valley of Excellence Program is to have 60 of our members donate to this cause.



VALLEY OF EXCELLENCE UPDATE

Brethren,

I'd like to take a few moments of your time to update you regarding the progress the Valley of Akron is making on achieving the **Valley of Excellence** designation for the 4th year in a row.

Valley of Excellence progress is at 26.34 %. Our goal for the year is 95%. Here is how we get there.

There are four (4) major categories that are contained within the Valley of Excellence criteria. First is Membership; this accounts for 50% of the score. Second is Service & Philanthropy; this accounts for 25% of the score. Third is Leadership & Development; this accounts for 15% of the score. Finally, Operations accounts for 10% of the score.

Membership is the most critical; this goal can only be reached by all members of the Valley assisting. Retention and recruitment of new members is the main goal of this category. Also included in this is Brother 2 Brother communications, Family Life, Rite on the Road, Reunions, and orientations. This is all about the member. Currently, we have less than 5% of the needed points. Failure on this category fails a Valley for the Valley of Excellence.

At Grand Chapter RAM on Wednesday October 9th, our Grand Master Paul A. Weglage, 33° gave a brief talk regarding membership and apathy in the Blue Lodge. He started with 10 Master Masons; by differences in opinions, family and work conflicts, disagreements between brothers, and more, only 1 Master Mason remained committed to his Lodge. That 1 brother brought in another brother; then there were 2. They each brought in a brother; then there were 8. You can see the picture. As a dependent body to the Blue Lodge, we need to get members to the Blue Lodge, which in turn can provide members to the Valley.

Are you one of the disgruntled members, or are you one who seeks new brothers and new ideas?

Our next criteria is **Service & Philanthropy**. We are currently at 6.25%. Our biggest challenge is coming soon. The Blue Envelope campaign is going to be starting this month. While you may have gone online to contribute, this does not count towards our goals; we need the old-fashioned means to achieve this goal. Please write a check or get a money order, place it in the blue envelope, and mail it back to Supreme Council. This is the only way it counts for this goal.

Can we count on you? Even \$5.00 is enough to qualify for your participation towards our goal!

Leadership & Development is next. This is achieved by our leadership of the Valley – our line officers as well as past presiding officers. It's great to get new members to our Valley, but do we keep them educated and learning more of what their membership in the Scottish Rite means. We've attained our maximum allotment of 5% of the required 15% in State Participation; we need Member Education and Mentoring for the remaining 10%.

Finally, is **Operations**; this is primarily our Trustees, Executive Secretary, and Treasurer. This accounts for 10% with an additional 5% bonus possible. We already have 10.2% in this category with additional bonus points coming for their continued work. We as a Valley have an administrative team that personifies EXCELLENCE! Let's don't let them down.

The Valley of Excellence program is not for every Valley. Some chose not to participate or reach for these lofty goals. This is NOT so with the Valley of Akron! We ARE a Valley of Excellence. And with everyone's assistance, we will remain a Valley of Excellence.




