M.A.P.R. (MASONIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAM REPORT)

Brethren:

Many, many thanks to everyone who made the 2024 Masonic Assistance Program (MAP) a success.

In October, we had only \$4,700 in the MAP account.

We had lost a rather significant contributor.

But through the work of our Ambassadors, Presiding Officers, and other AASR members, the word got out that we needed help.

And our Masonic Brethren and families proved brotherly love and charity for others.

Steve Prentice, TPM, was a significant solicitor this year, when he was visiting Lodges as DEO. Thanks Steve!

Another contributor this year delivered a big, important surprise this year: **Valley Treasurer Christopher Schill** drummed up the donation of 100 laundry baskets. Through the power of the internet, Chris was able to solicit donations from all over the country. And then he was able to pick up the baskets at a local Walmart. Ingenious!

Thanks, as always, to **Hudson Lodge #510** for starting early. They picked up the groceries at Acme on Massillon Road in Green. Then they delivered them to Craftsmen's Park.

Thanks to **Brother Gregg Walton**. Walton opened the dining hall at Craftsman Park, where we assembled the baskets.

And many thanks to all the brothers and families who assembled and distributed baskets. Job well done! We should all be proud of what we accomplished this year.

Between Brethren and their generous family members, 56 people attended.

41 of those were Brothers.

Together, they assembled **95 baskets**.

Each basket was worth \$100.

From October 1 to December 18, we raised over \$10,500. This was in addition our beginning balance.

17 Masonic bodies donated, including Blue Lodges, Commandery, and Eastern Star Chapters.

...as did many individual members, individuals, and businesses.

Many folks told me this is very fun and rewarding event.

It's always cool to see how quickly 95 baskets can be prepared for distribution.

The best part is when a full basket is handed over to the recipients. Their eyes will say thank you better than their words. You can tell they are really thankful.

VALLEY OF EXCELLENCE UPDATE

Brethren:

Following is an update on our progress regarding the Valley of Excellence Program. We are currently at...

MEMBERSHIP: 11.90 points of a possible 50 SERVICE & PHILANTHROPY: 20.17 points of a possible 25 LEADERSHIP & DEVELOPMENTS: 10 points of a possible 15 OPERATION: 14.80 points of a possible 10 BONUS POINTS: We are ranked third in Ohio, 17th in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction.

As all can see, we are far behind of the needed points for Membership. This has been an area where we need the most help. And the good part is that every member can assist in meeting this goal.

Many members speak of the "Lessons of Masonry." We learn in the York Rite, that the Master Mason with out the York Rite Mason is a story half told, and a song half sung. I've been a York Rite Mason for over 35 years.

Unfortunately, I didn't learn of all that the Scottish Rite has to offer until 8 years ago. While the York Rite gives a much more complete view of Masonry; it tells the full story of Masonry and the building of King Solomon's Temple.

What makes the Scottish Rite so much more is that it not only talks about Masonry, but it also prepares and gives the path for the "Good Man" not only to be a "Better Man", but to be a Brother.

When we look at our 29 Degrees, how many not only talk about Masonry, but also have moral and ethical implications contained within the Degree as well. These moral and ethical implications are what makes a Mason a Brother!

Your Blue Envelope Appeal will be arrived in October. Please consider donating to this valuable charity.




