- **3) Operations:** 10/15, plus 5 bonus points.


However, the most important goal, **Membership**, we have not reached our expectation of restoring or recruiting 24 members. We are presently at 10.



Devotion to Country and **Service to Humanity** are two of Scottish Rite's six Core Values, which is why we are so pleased to recognize and honor youth who demonstrate leadership, academic achievement, and patriotism with our Americanism ROTC and JROTC Awards.

The Junior ROTC distinction recognizes high school youth enrolled in the Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps (JROTC) with an award for their scholastic excellence and demonstrated ideals of Americanism. The award consists of a medal and ribbon to be worn on the JROTC uniform and a certificate suitable for framing.

The ROTC initiative recognizes second- and third-year cadets enrolled in the Reserve Officers Training Corps (ROTC) who are outstanding in their class academically and in character.

Three recognitions are awarded: a certificate suitable for framing; a medal engraved with the Scottish Rite double-headed eagle, ROTC Education, and Americanism; and a ribbon to wear along with the medal when wearing the ROTC uniform.

MORE THAN WORDS Reflections from the Junior Warden, Aroba Lodge of Perfection

Greetings, Brethren:

There's a certain magic in Masonic ritual. It's not just the words -- it's the meaning, the movement, the silence between lines where understanding dawns. I learned this firsthand during the Spring Reunion, standing as the Junior Warden in the Aroba Lodge of Perfection. I'm still relatively new to the Scottish Rite, but that didn't matter much when the candelabras began to illuminate, the bell began to toll, and the 14th degree began. In that moment, we weren't just Masons--we were guardians of something eternal.



The 14th degree is no small task. It's perhaps one of the most important degrees after the Master Mason Degree. It is a heavy and meaningful allegory, rich with symbolism about duty, virtue, and fidelity to truth. I remember studying the part over and over, practicing on Sunday nights, I wanted to get it perfect — not for the applause, but because I felt the weight of it. While going to practice and having a degree director who was deeply in tune with the history and the symbolism in the degree, learning the bigger picture and the background info about the meaning of where we were portrayed to be, what we were saying, and what we were emphasizing to the candidates, really drives home why this degree is the pinnacle to the Lodge of Perfection, a culmination of lessons leading to something more: transformation.

But when the lights came up and we took our places, I felt it: that edge of nervous energy, the kind that crackles under your skin. There were moments I stumbled. A few lines slip away here and there, like sand through my fingers. I make eye contact for a quick prompt, adjust, and find my rhythm again. And yet, in that imperfection, something powerful happened: the allegory lived on.

Because Freemasonry, like life, isn't about flawless performance. It's about the heart behind the effort. My brothers didn't flinch. They caught my cue with grace, and we moved together like a single voice telling an ancient truth. I looked into the eyes of the candidate — many of them just beginning their Scottish Rite journey — and I saw understanding and acknowledgement. Not because I delivered every line perfectly, but because the spirit of the work was there. The light broke through.

There's something deeply satisfying about standing in the spotlight — not as an actor, but as a Mason, taking part in a living tradition that stretches back generations. You're not just telling a story; you are the story. And when it's done, when the lights dim and the cast exhales in that quiet, sacred afterglow, you realize it was never about you. It was about them. The candidates. The Craft. The message.

I walked out of that room proud... not because I nailed every line, but because I did the work and I served my valley. Because I gave something real. And in doing so, I grew — not just as a Mason, but as a man.

There's no greater reward than that.


LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES IN YOUR VALLEY

VALLEY OF EXCELLENCE PROGRESS UPDATE

Brethren:

I'd like to take a few moments of your time to update you regarding the progress the Valley of Akron is making on achieving the Valley of Excellence designation for the 4th year in a row.

Four major categories constitute Valley of Excellence criteria. First is **Membership**; this accounts for 50% of the score. Second is **Service & Philanthropy**; this accounts for 25% of the score. Third is **Leadership & Development**; this accounts for 15% of the score. Finally, **Operations** accounts for 10% of the score.

Membership is the most critical. This goal can only be reached if all members of the Valley assist. Retention and recruitment of new members is the main goal of this category. Also included in this is **Brother 2 Brother Communications**, **Family Life**, **Rite on the Road**, **Reunions**, and **Orientations**. This is all about the member. Currently, we have less than 5% of the needed points; a Valley that fails this category is not a Valley of Excellence.

Brethren, this is an excerpt from my October message:

We have excelled in all areas but Membership. Unfortunately, we are still well behind in our goals for recruitment, retention, and reinstatement.

Out of a possible 50 points, we only have 19.3.

This gives us a total of 74.3 points total.

We need at least 21 more points to receive the Valley of Excellence designation.

Areas that are lacking are in Brother-to-Brother engagement; this does not just need to be by our Executive Secretary, but by brothers reaching out to brothers. Simply notify Illustrious Brother Tilden when you reach out to other brothers so that he can record the engagement.

Another area that we need to watch is in retention; if you know of a brother that has fallen on hard times or has become disenfranchised with Scottish Rite, reach out to him as well as our executive staff and presiding officers.

There are many that have been suspended or are in jeopardy of being suspended. These need to be kept to a minimum as we lose 30 points if this exceeds predetermined levels.

Working to keep brothers involved is paramount to not only the Valley of Excellence, but also to the success of our Valley. Lastly, recruitment, this is the hardest of all. This accounts for 30 points of the total 50 points needed for the membership category. The hardest part of this goal is it is an all or nothing count. If we are able to bring 24 new Scottish Rite members to our Valley, we will receive the entire 30 points; if we bring in just 23 members, we receive 0 points. Is this difficult, yes, it is; but this is what distinguishes the best of the best.

Your Blue Envelope Appeal arrived in October. Please consider donating to this valuable charity.


